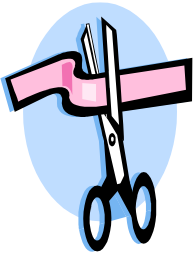

I would like to announce that due to a glitch in our original plans we were unable to secure permission to obtain a right of way onto our property located at Isaac Shelby Drive at this time.

Due to that problem and some other engineering challenges in developing the property we went shopping for another piece of land and found something wonderful. A 6.96 acre piece of property in Hi Point Industrial Park. Hi Point Industrial Park is on the same road as Kroger. You enter the industrial park off of Hwy 55 just up the road from where we always conduct our annual intersection collection by turning right onto Mr. Vernon Drive. You turn left onto Hudson Blvd and go into the cul-de-sac. The industrial park has street lights along the way, paved rain gutters along the road, sidewalks, intermittent fire hydrants and is populated with several retail businesses and a few light industrial plants. The property sits directly in the center of the cul-de-sac and gently slopes away from the road. There is approximately 3 acres or more of buildable land with KU electric, Atmos Energy Gas, Shelbyville Municipal Water and Sewers on the property, and cable access through Insight Communications.

I'm thrilled with the city sewers, I love the lay of the land and there is a light woods in back of the building site with the potential for walking paths that wind down the side of a hill and end in a valley of fertile grassland with a nice creek flowing through it. A lovely place to walk dogs or graze horses as Fran, our architect, said and room at the back of the property for a small four stall barn to house rescue horses in overnight. I love the fact that we are easily visible from the road and the paving or stone for the driveway will be minimal compared to our current site.
